Natia Mirotadze (Universität Salzburg)

The Bible in the Georgian Tradition

The lecture summarises our modern knowledge about the Georgian Bible, its origin and revision history which will be traced back through extant Georgian biblical manuscripts. I will also concentrate on why and how the Georgian Bible was changed. Medieval Georgian philologists were well aware of the fact that texts had been spoiled during transmission and their correction was necessary according to the credible sources. However, these credible sources were different in different eras. For correction on the one hand different translation technique was applied and on the other hand Georgian literary language was developed enough to reflect faithfully linguistic phenomena characteristic for the Septuagint.

Natia Mirotadze is a Postdoctoral Research Fellow at the University of Salzburg, Department of Biblical Studies and Ecclesiastical History; Researcher at Korneli Kekelidze Georgian National Centre of Manuscripts, Department of Codicology and Textual Studies. She studies issues connected to the origin, revision and transmission history as well as the translation technique of the Georgian version of the Septuagint; old Georgian language; the history of the Georgian literary language; textology and editorial techniques; Georgian codicology and paleography.
